- 4 to 5 pair of socks
- 2 to 3 pair of underwear
- Long underwear (optional)
- 2 pair of jeans or corduroys
- 1 pair of waterproof overalls or ski pants (optional)
- Top Layers (3 to 4 tee shirts and two or more sweatshirts, hoodies, fleeces, flannel shirts or sweaters)
- Water and wind resistant outer shell
- Poncho or rain gear
- Good pair of waterproof gloves or mittens (second pair optional)
- Hand warmers (optional)
- Knit cap for sleeping (optional 2nd knit cap for use during the day)
- Flashlight with fresh batteries
- Canteen or water bottle
- Mess kit (knife, fork, spoon, plate, bowl and cup)
- Inexpensive pair of sunglasses for snow glare
- Chap Stick or Vaseline for lips and sunscreen
- Medications (discuss with Adult Leader) and toiletries
- Small towel
- Trash bag for wet and dirty clothes
- Camp chair (optional)
- \$5 to \$10 for incidentals and lunch on the way home

- Large propane stove and 20# propane with wrench
- Small propane stoves with 1# propane bottles or 20# propane with stem
- Propane lanterns with 1# propane bottles or Coleman lanterns with fuel and funnel
- Good supply of waterproof matches and spare mantels
- Large tarp(s) and ropes for shelter
- Rope bag
- Peg bag (appropriate stakes for forest or beach)
- Duct tape
- Toilet paper
- Cooler(s)
- Water supply jugs
- Juice jug (and mix)
- Water jug
- First aid kit
- Wash basins/scrubber/detergent
- Hand sanitizer
- Trash bags (consider a trash can for large group)
- Coffee pot
- Water pot
- Coffee, tea, hot chocolate, sugar, creamer, sugar substitute
- Pots/pans/utensils/cutting boards needed to cook and serve menu
- Paper towels, aluminum foil, etc.
- Charcoal, lighter and cooking grate if called for
- Dutch ovens and tools if called for

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
